The Pastor's Door

As we enter February, our hearts and minds turn toward a sacred season in the church year—Lent. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 18th, marking the beginning of forty days of reflection, repentance, and renewal as we journey with Jesus toward the cross.

Ash Wednesday is a day rich with meaning. The ashen cross placed on our foreheads is a sign of humility and a reminder of our mortality: “Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” Yet, it is also a sign of love—a reflection of the cross marked on us in baptism, and a reminder that we are God’s beloved children. The ashes call us to repentance, but also to hope, for God “is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love” (Joel 2:13).

Lent is a time to pause, to take stock of our lives, and to draw closer to God. It is a season for prayer, fasting, and a time to reconnect with God. Some may choose to give something up, while others may take on a new spiritual practice. However, you observe this season, let it be a time to reflect on what Jesus has done for us and to prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

This year, I invite you to join me each Tuesday evening for our special Lenten book study. This year my friend and former seminary professor Dr. Jim Papandrea will be teach us about the Book of Revelation. We will be joining him Tuesday evenings starting on February 24 at 6pm on Zoom. Books is called “The Wedding of the Lamb” and copies will be arriving soon and will be \$20. This will be an informative and exciting study for Lent and I encourage you to join us! For those who cannot attend at that time, we will be recording the zoom meetings so they can be watched at your leisure. If you have any questions, please ask me.



May this holy season draw us closer to Christ and to one another.




Lenten Study

A Word from Finance

Church stewardship giving is fundamentally a spiritual act of gratitude, obedience, and trust in God's provision rather than just a financial obligation. Key motivations include supporting the church's mission and outreach, fostering personal spiritual growth, and acknowledging God as the ultimate source of all blessings. Giving helps transform hearts, builds community, and ensures the sustainability of ministry.


Key Reasons for church stewardship giving include:

- **Response to God's Generosity/Grace:** Giving is a way to express gratitude for the blessings, love, and life received from God.
- **Obedience to Biblical Teaching:** Many give because it is a commanded, spiritual act that demonstrates faithfulness, such as tithing.
- **Supporting Mission and Vision:** Donors are motivated by a desire to see the church's impact in the community and support its long-term ministry goals.
- **Spiritual Growth/Discipleship:** Giving cultivates a joyful, compassionate, and less materialistic heart, acting as a spiritual discipline that prevents stagnation.
- **Trust in God's Provision:** It serves as an act of faith, showing trust that God will provide for personal needs while giving to the church.
- **Tangible Impact and Trust in Leadership:** People are more inclined to give when they see clear, transparent, and effective use of funds, and when church leadership is fully committed.

Stewardship is viewed as a total way of life-managing time, talent, and treasure-rather than just a periodic fundraising effort.
