Rest is important, but so is doing what God has asked of you.

I am profoundly grateful for all that you do for this community and this church! But if you are looking for a time to start changing this church for the better, I would suggest the time be now! And if you do have such a suggestion, I would encourage you to pray for it and see how you can be a part of the change. Not just as the person with the idea, but as a person who is willing to see that idea through.

January can be a difficult time for many as we feel we too are stripped bare, but know that even in the winter God is with us and spring is just around the corner!

A Word from Finance

A few years ago, we started a new process for preparing our budget with an attempt at telling our story. This year, we added to that story by asking our committees to consider the “Faith is the foundation of Generosity.”

They were asked to specifically state their mission, budget needs (current story), ideas for 2026 (rewriting their story), prayer requests (Be specific-tell the story) and if there is a dream for their committee that would require a major financial input, would they be willing to fundraise for it.

Mission: Our church strives to be an inclusive and grow community, which will serve others and share the knowledge of God’s unconditional love, celebrate the love of God as a community. The current story states that weekly bulletins, some supplies along with pulpit supply including music are an important part of worship. Keeping up with maintenance is the story of the trustees.

In rewriting our story, worship wants to continue with the same supplies from worship. Trustees are looking towards the repair or replacement of the heating system and thermostats and the addition of Air Conditioning. In 2026 missions is looking to support the Illini 4000 dinner and donations to their program. Ideas for the Scouts for 2026 would be for the church to pay the total recharter fee of \$200 for the Pach and for the Troop.

Our prayer requests are to make our worship dynamic & inspiring, what avenues to head in our heat and air conditioning concerns, continuing prays and support with funds and physical support for other missions the church supports, and for each scout and leader to be successful in their trail and that funding is not a cause to stop attending the program.

And oh, the dreams. Trustees want to replace the boiler and add air conditioning. Scouts dream for each scout and leader to have to pay for membership fees, camping fees, gas for trips, upkeep on equipment. Most leaders pay for their own fees, gas and equipment.
