### The Pastor's Door

## **Reverend Cory Young**

Now that the holidays are all but over, life seems to get back to normal. We go back to school, we have finished traveling to see family and friends, we have to set an alarm so we can get up on time for work, and slowly the Christmas lights in our neighborhoods are



turned off and taken down. It seems like in two weeks we will forget that Christmas ever happened. We find ourselves lamenting over the darkness coming so early, and yet something inside of us reminds us that even though there will be cold months ahead of us, spring is just around the corner.

Often this time of year I think about to the celebrations that happened in the first century. We don't know a whole lot about weddings, but what we do know is that the celebration lasts for more than a day. In the Gospel of John, the first miracle Jesus performs is changing water into wine. He makes the wine, the wedding celebration continues, and the host is saved the embarrassment of not being prepared.

Maybe instead of going right back in the routine we do for eleven months of the year, we do something different. Maybe we stay at the wedding party just a bit longer. Granted there is work that always needs to be done, but maybe we need to celebrate a little bit longer.

So often we get to January 2, and it seems the joy of Christmas is gone as we check our emails for the first time in two weeks. We see the meetings that need to happen at work. We find that our time with family stressed us out. Everything we put off for the last two weeks needs to be taken care of right now. Yet, January is more than the first month of the year. It is a time for us to focus on what we experienced over the Advent and Christmas seasons. The waiting, the joy, the sorrow, the worry, the excitement shouldn't just be boxed up.

From Me to You continues to collect and distribute clothing and miscellaneous items to any person that comes to us. The average number of individuals served this year is 642 per month. We are seeing more homelessness, though. More people living in their cars. Warm socks and underwear (Small, medium and large) are needed. Walmart has been good keeping us supplied with the plus sizes.

After having security cameras up for about a year, the sync module disappeared. It has been replaced, but the booster we purchased to extend the Wi-Fi signal "won't go through a brick wall. You'll have to run a cable from the church building into your building, for around \$1,000.00." as told to Craig. We are considering other options. Someone with IT and security cameras experience would be a blessing.

Aside from donations being left outside and the shed and bags being ripped open and gone through inside the shed, all is good at the swap.
